



Getting hired in a trending career area

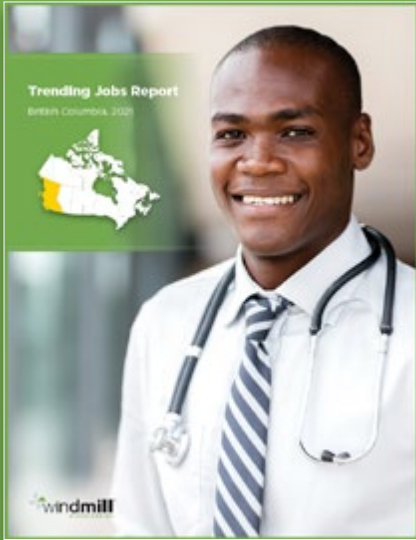
